Dear Mr Yawngwe:

I am writing on behalf of the European Burma Network (EBN) to inform you that the Euro-Burma Office's observer status in EBN has been revoked, effectively immediately. The EBN took this action with a quorum present at its meeting this past weekend in Athens, Greece, and the vote was unanimous among all members present.

Specifically, under Article 2.1 of the EBN Rules & Procedures, "[m]embership is open to organisations . . . whose objectives are consistent with those of EBN." According to Article 1, the objectives of EBN are:

- 1) To promote political and economic action in Europe, based on the mandate of Burma's elected leaders and ethnic leadership.
- 2) To provide a forum for the Members to discuss and agree common campaign actions to promote human rights and democracy in Burma.
- 3) To exchange information among the Members regarding the political situation in Burma.

Specifically, the EBN determined that the Euro-Burma Office's actions were no longer consistent with the "mandate of Burma's elected leaders and ethnic leadership."
