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Excellency,

I am writing to you to apprise you of the heart-breaking situation in Myanmar, where people are suffering from overlapping crises due to the violent acts committed by the inhumane military group against the people of Myanmar.

It has been over 66 months since the military attempted an illegal coup. The military has brutally murdered 8,282 people. More than 31,500 people have been arbitrarily arrested, detained, and tortured. According to the OCHA, more than 3.7 million have been displaced, and over 16.2 million people are in immediate need of humanitarian assistance. Nearly half of the population is now living under the national poverty line. The military junta has executed four democracy activists who were given death sentences, and the military courts have sentenced many civilians to years of imprisonment including life imprisonment without just cause.

The junta continues to ignore the will of the people and violate their fundamental rights. Amidst people's suffering caused by the manmade and natural disasters, the military junta has continued carrying out of aerial and artillery attacks across the country.

As with my previous letters, I would like to draw your attention to the unspeakable tragedy unfolding in Myanmar.

The situation in Myanmar has continued to deteriorate further as the military group intensified its attacks on civilian populations across the country. Verified reports indicate a pattern of deliberate and unlawful violence, including the targeting of schools, hospitals, religious buildings, and residential areas, as well as the continued violation of human rights.

According to the data collected by AAPP, from 1 to 15 June 2026, (17) people in total; (6) women and (11) men, were killed by the junta across the country, including (3) children under the age of 18. The identities of these victims have been verified. Among them, (12) people were killed by the junta's airstrikes, marking the highest cause of death. During the stated period, the AAPP has also received information regarding the death of (48) civilians, as a result of junta attacks, whose identities have yet to be confirmed.

As atrocities of the military junta continues across the country, junta forces killed 28 civilians, including women and children, in an airstrike on a Buddhist monastery and a ground assault in Yae Twin Kone Village tract of Bago Region on 5 March 2026, according to a new investigation released by Fortify Rights on 9 June. Among them 14-year-old kid was shot and killed when tried to flee and body of a pregnant woman among the dead found later.

In another devastating event, junta forces killed nearly 40 civilians in Myitche Town of Magway Region, discarding their bodies on public streets, inside residential homes, and within religious compounds. The multi-week military operation forced more than 19,100 civilians to flee their homes. During their deployment in Myitche, junta forces systematically targeted economic and residential infrastructure, destroying approximately 1,000 homes across 18 villages.

In another attack, junta forces carried out airstrikes on villages in Deemaw Soe Township, Karenni (Kayah) State, at around 6:00 pm Myanmar time on 4 June 2026. The strike on Htee Hla Thoo Village killed a Baptist pastor who was also a youth leader, and left other civilians injured and homes destroyed. The Kayah Baptist Association (KBA) Youth Department issued a formal statement of deep sorrow, extending its condolences to his family and loved ones.

In a targeted, late-night operation, junta forces completely stripped the historic Yangon headquarters of the National League for Democracy (NLD) party, removing its primary signboard and flagpole from the building. The dismantling of the party's remaining physical presence occurred one week before jailed State Counsellor Daw Aung San Suu Kyi turns 81 on 19 June, amidst an escalating global campaign demanding proof of life from the junta. The systematic stripping of the party's headquarters puts a definitive punctuation mark on the junta's ongoing effort to erase the legacy of the NLD from Myanmar's physical landscape.

The people of Myanmar have been experiencing the human-made dreadful disaster for over 5 and half years. It has created a safe haven for cybercrime. Clearly, the root cause of the people's suffering in Myanmar is the military junta and the military dictatorship.

The junta is now trying to conceal this depravity and its international crimes with sham elections. The junta's so-called election is illegal and deceitful. This fake election and its manufactured results have only been prolonging the crisis and violence as well as people's suffering and enforcing military supremacy. It has been clearly attested to by the further intensification of the junta's atrocities including aerial attacks on civilians and the junta's nasty dismissal of ASEAN Five-Point Consensus.

Therefore the military junta and its deceitful process must be categorically rejected.

On the other hand, the National Unity Government and major ethnic democratic forces established the Steering Council for the Emergence of a Federal Democratic Union (SCEF), which is rooted in the people, supported by the people and accountable for the people. The SCEF is committed to protecting and promoting the essence of federal democracy and self-determination.

On behalf of the people of Myanmar, I appeal again to you to support our people effectively. I also wish to urge you and the international community to extend sustained effective support to the SCEF and its efforts for building a federal democratic union of Myanmar.

Accordingly it is high time for the international community, in particular the UN and the UN Security Council, to be bold and take immediate and decisive actions without further delay. Only through a concerted and coordinated effort from the international community to isolate the military and cut it off from all support including the flow of arms and weapons, jet fuel, and money to the military junta will Myanmar return its path towards democracy and create a just, peaceful and stable environment.

As usual, I enclose herewith the Information Update on the current situation in Myanmar as of 15 June 2026 for your kind perusal.
